Step back in time with this one-of-a-kind primitive stone planter, crafted from rugged sandstone and originally carved as a drinking trough. Dating to the early part of the 19th century, this decorative 150-year-old piece has an irregular, organic shape and a beautifully weathered surface with an original patina of moss and lichen.

The natural stone surface and softly irregular outline give it understated organic character, making it well suited to naturalistic planting schemes, Japanese-inspired gardens, wabi sabi interiors or quiet decorative corners outdoors.

Despite its age, this sturdy stone planter remains in excellent condition and is ready to grace a garden or home with distinctive charm. Use it outdoors to add texture and age to a new garden design, or display it indoors as a unique decorative accent piece.

Its versatile nature makes it ideal as a container for bonsai plants, herbs or naturalistic planting. The planter also has a drainage hole suitable for a water pipe, allowing it to be adapted as a simple water feature if desired.

This primitive stone planter is a true gem for the discerning collector or designer seeking to

infuse their space with layered history and natural character. Embrace the beauty of time-worn materials and let this special piece become a cherished focal point in an established or newly curated garden.

A good scale, with an overall length of 55cm / 22 inches. The thick stone base is carved with an inside depth of approximately 16cm / 6 inches.

Origin and period: English, early 19th century. Hand carved sandstone drinking trough, now suitable as a primitive planter, bonsai pot or water feature.
